

Area of Learning Geography – Italy

Use world maps, atlases and globes to identify the United Kingdom and Italy.

Locational knowledge

Locate the world's countries within the Roman Empire, using maps to focus on Europe concentrating on Italy's environmental regions, key physical and human characteristics, countries, and major cities.

Place knowledge

Understand geographical similarities and differences through the study of human and physical geography of a region of the United Kingdom, a region in a European country (Italy).

Geographical skills and fieldwork

Use maps, atlases, globes and digital/computer mapping to locate countries and describe features studied.

Human and physical geography

Describe and understand key aspects of:

Physical Geography, land types within Italy.

Human geography, including: types of settlement and land use, economic activity including trade links, and the distribution of natural resources including energy, food, minerals and water.

Area of Learning-PE field games, dance and gymnastics

Games- Net/wall and Invasion games

Use running, jumping, throwing and catching in isolation and in combination

Play competitive games, modified where appropriate basketball, , hockey, and apply basic principles suitable for attacking and defending

Gym- Balance and Apparatus

Develop flexibility, strength, technique, control

Dance- Snooker Championships

Perform dances using a range of movement patterns.

Area of Learning- Art

Create sketches of Roman Mosaics to record their observations and use them to review and revisit ideas.

Improve their mastery of art and design techniques, including drawing, painting and sculpture with a range of materials [for example, pencil, charcoal, paint, clay] Use range of materials to create mosaics.

Research great artists producing mosaics in this time.

DT- Cooking and Nutrition

Learn about and cook Italian food

Understand and apply the principles of a healthy and varied diet.

Prepare and cook a variety of predominantly savoury dishes using a range of cooking techniques- making pizzas

Understand seasonality, and know where and how a variety of ingredients are grown, reared, caught and processed.

Area of Learning-Music

Roman Play Songs

Use their voices and play musical instruments with increasing accuracy, fluency, control and expression.

Appreciate and understand a wide range of high-quality live and recorded music.

Develop an understanding of the history of music.

Espresso Music- Dynamics

Use their voices and play musical instruments with increasing accuracy, fluency, control and expression.

Listen with attention to detail and recall sounds with increasing aural memory.

Area of Learning History:-

The Roman Empire and its impact on Britain.

Julius Caesar's attempted invasion in 55-54 BC.

The Roman Empire by AD 42 and the power of its army.

The successful invasion by Claudius and conquest, including Hadrian's Wall.

British resistance, for example, Boudica.

The 'Romanisation' of Britain: sites such as Caerwent and the impact of technology, culture and beliefs, including early Christianity.

Area of Learning-RE

How special is the relationship Jews have with God? Understand the special relationship between Jews and God and the promises they make to each other.

What is the most significant part of the Nativity story for Christians today? Understand the symbolism in the Christmas story. Think about what the different parts mean to Christians today.
